

AB 323 (KALRA)



Risks nursing facility closures that will reduce availability and access to senior care.



UNFAIR & EXCESSIVE

AB 323 exposes nursing care providers to severe penalties without consideration of mitigating factors and circumstances. This approach is unfair and creates financial instability for facilities already strained from the pandemic.



REDUCES ACCESS

Excessive fines and litigation risks may lead to facility closures, reducing access to care for seniors and disabled patients. Facilities serving disadvantaged communities could be most at risk.



JEOPARDIZES FUNDING

Indiscriminate citations and penalties endanger quality assurance funds that support patient care, forcing providers to make difficult decisions like reducing capacity or closing facilities.



LESS TRANSPARENCY

AB 323 distorts nursing care quality rankings, making it difficult for families to differentiate between wrongdoers and quality providers when finding a home for loved ones. It also confuses evaluation data that lawmakers rely on to make important policy changes.
